

REGULATION OF THE DEAN OF FTZ

No. 6/2024



Admissions to FTZ for Bachelor's and Master's Degrees Academic Year 2025/2026

Article 1

Introductory provisions

The organisation of the entrance examinations for the relevant academic year is governed by Section 48-50 of Act No. 111/98 Coll., on Higher Education Institutions, and the Statutes of the Czech University of Life Sciences Prague.

The admission procedure runs from 01/09/2024 to 15/12/2025. After this date, it is no longer possible to issue a decision on admission to study.

It is not possible to re-apply to the same study programme within the same academic year.

The main organisational unit involved in the admission procedure is the FTZ Study Department. In addition, the guarantors of the relevant programmes, teachers authorised by the departments to correct the examination tests and appointed members of the examination boards are involved in the procedure. The language examinations are supervised by the Department of Languages of the Faculty of Economics and Business Administration (FBE).

The admission procedure has been discussed with the respective programme guarantors.

The Faculty is committed to fully respecting the principles of non-discrimination throughout the admissions process and to promoting and ensuring equal access and opportunities for participants from all backgrounds, particularly disadvantaged or vulnerable groups. Furthermore, to apply a selection process that is fair, transparent and documented and to ensure equal opportunities for participants.

Article 2

Admission Procedure for Bachelor's Degree Programmes

General principles

The condition for admission to the Bachelor's degree is the attainment of a full secondary education of a general nature or a full secondary vocational education. In case of completion of secondary education abroad, it is necessary to provide a "Nostrification" of the acquired degree or a decision on the recognition of previous studies issued by the CZU in Prague.

Applicants who submit a matriculation certificate or submit a certificate from the last completed year of secondary school registered in the Czech Republic with an average of up to and including 1.6 will be admitted without an entrance examination. The latest dates for the submission of the corresponding certificate for each stage of the admission procedure are given in Article 4 - Dates of the admission examinations for Bachelor's programmes.

Students who have successfully participated in regional and national rounds of subject Olympiads sponsored by the Ministry of Education, Youth and Sports of the Czech Republic or participated in the national round of the Secondary School Vocational Activity (SOC), as well as participants in vocational competitions sponsored by the Ministry of Education, Youth and Sports (MSMT-Competition in Foreign Languages and Geography Olympiad), and graduates of the international Advanced Placement (AP - the exam is provided by the Center for Talented Youth www.ctm-academy.cz) with a score of 5 or 4 in AP Biology or AP Environmental Science for the ZTS programme and AP Human Geography or AP Macroeconomics for the ICARD programme, are eligible for admission without an entrance examination to the relevant Bachelor's programme. Students who have placed at the top of the Olympiads sponsored by the Ministry of Education and participated in the national round of the Secondary School Vocational Activity (SOC) may receive a scholarship of up to CZK 5,000 per month according to the Rector's Directive on the Support of Talented Applicants for Study at CZU.

Applications to study at the FTZ are submitted electronically at is.czu.cz/application

Applicants from EU countries pay a foreign language fee of CZK 13,000/academic year and applicants from non-EU countries pay a foreign language fee of CZK 25,000/ academic year for studying in the International Cooperation in Agriculture and Rural Development (ICARD) programme in English, by credit card (information on this payment method can be found in the electronic information system after successful completion of the entrance examination), bank transfer, cheque or in person at the cash desk of the CZU Library. **The fee is payable by the student's enrolment. In the event that the student does not enrol, the non-refundable part of the fee is CZK 8,000.**

Applicants can also obtain further information about the requirements and content of the admission procedure in Czech and English on the FTZ website in the "Applicants for Studies" section. Information is also provided at the "Open Days" on 8 November 2024, 17 and 18 January 2025 and March 2025 (dates to be specified and announced on the Faculty's website), and in selected print media.

Article 3

Course of the Entrance Examination for Bachelor's Programmes

The application form must be completed electronically, contain the prescribed requirements and include one selected study programme for the Bachelor's degree:

- **Tropical Agriculture (TZ)**
- **International Cooperation in Agriculture and Rural Development (ICARD)**

The duly completed application form must be accompanied by a **handling fee of CZK 750 (€ 30** for payments from abroad), which must be paid by credit card (information on this payment method can be found in the electronic information system when submitting the application form), bank transfer, cheque or in person at the cash desk of the CZU Library. In the case of multiple applications, the fee is paid for each application separately (specific symbols differ), so multiple applications cannot be paid in bulk - applications that do not have a payment assigned by the last day of submission will not be processed. **The fee is non-refundable at any stage of the admission procedure.** Only complete, paid and submitted applications, with all required documents uploaded where applicable, will be accepted for further processing.

All applicants will be informed about the admission examination by e-mail via the University Information System at least 30 days before the date of the examination. (The course of the admission procedure will be published on the portal is.czu.cz/application). The invitation will state the date, place and time of the written examination.

Candidates must bring their ID card (or passport) to the entrance exam.

The applicant is admitted to study after fulfilling the conditions of the admission procedure and paying the study fee. Applicants who graduate from a secondary school abroad must also submit a "Nostrification" of the obtained degree or a decision on the recognition of previous studies issued by the CZU in Prague.

On the basis of the valid Institutional Accreditation of CZU (whereby the University fulfils the condition stipulated in Article 48, paragraph 6 of Act No. 111/1998 Coll., on Higher Education), the recognition of previous education is also carried out by the University (in this case, we no longer require a document of "Nostrification"). In the admissions procedure, the University will thus assess the fulfilment of the condition of secondary education with a matriculation examination pursuant to

Section 48(4) of the Higher Education Act. Upon enrolment, applicants must submit a certified copy of their school leaving certificate.

If a candidate cannot attend the entrance examination in Stage 1 or Stage 2 for serious reasons, he/she may take it at an alternative date. The request for **an alternative date** with justification must be submitted by e-mail no later than on the day of the regular entrance examination to the e-mail address of the FTZ Study Department.

The supplementary stage of the entrance examinations is organised to fill the capacity of the programme, which may, however, already be filled from the 1st or 2nd stage of the regular term or from an alternative term of the regular round.

The dean of the FTZ decides whether or not the student has passed the entrance examination on the basis of the results of written tests and oral interviews. The dean will notify the applicant of his/her decision electronically on the portal is.czu.cz/application, usually within 7 days (it is necessary to monitor the course of the admission procedure.) Applicants will receive the original proof of admission after enrolment.

Admission to the ICARD programme

The admission procedure in the ICARD programme, unlike the TA programme, is a two-round procedure. In Round 1, which takes place without the presence of the applicant, the admissions committee selects applicants on the basis of their aptitude for study - based on their **current field of study and the results of previous studies completed, and the experience and aptitude for study contained in their CV**. The CV and the report card from the last completed year (or the school leaving certificate with a transcript of marks) must be uploaded at the same time as the application to the University's electronic system (UIS). All documents are required in Czech or English. We require an officially certified translation for the report card.

Part of Round 1 is the Scio GAP online test in English language focused on the general overview of the candidate - organized in cooperation with Scio. The conditions for registering for the Scio GAP test can be found at www.scio.cz. Candidates can use more than one Scio GAP test date for a given stage of the admission procedure, the best result will be counted.

In the first round, which assesses the prerequisites for study, a maximum of 50 points can be obtained. The assessment criteria are:

- 20 points - General Overview (Scio GAP online test)
- 20 points - Experience and aptitude for study (CV)
- 10 points - Results of previous studies (report card)

Selected applicants who reach the minimum threshold of 30 points are invited by e-mail via UIS to the second round of the admission procedure - the actual entrance examination.

In the case of successful completion of the entrance examination for applicants from countries requiring a visa to the Czech Republic, a confirmation of accommodation and the Unified Certificate of Admission to Study will be sent to the applicant by means of a transport service. However, these documents will be sent only after the proof of payment of the foreign language tuition fee and the nostrification or decision on recognition of previous education have been sent electronically to the FTZ Study Department.

Article 5

Subjects of the entrance examination for Bachelor programmes and their assessment

The actual entrance exam for the Bachelor's degree programmes ICARD and TZ is written, only the Czech language exam is oral. The subject matter of all subjects is within the scope of the secondary school curriculum. The examination teams are composed of experts in the respective subject, the written language tests are evaluated by teachers from the Department of Languages of the Faculty of Business and Economics of the Czech Technical University.

Entrance examinations for both programmes consist of two subjects - languages and a specialised subject. For the ICARD programme, the whole course of the entrance examination, including the specialised test, is in English. For applicants who cannot prove their knowledge of the Czech language by taking the matriculation examination in Czech, the TZ programme also offers an admission interview in Czech, aimed at assessing the level of language skills required for studying the relevant programme. Applicants who submit a matriculation exam in Czech do not have to take the oral interview.

The **maximum number of points and the minimum threshold for admission** vary by programme (Tables 1 and 2).

^{Pozn.)} The Czech language exam includes an interview in Czech. Candidates who provide evidence of a matriculation exam in Czech do not have to take the Czech language entrance exam and receive full points.

Candidates are **admitted to study at the FTZ according to their scores on** the entrance examination until the study programme is full (Table 3). Sample tests for all subjects can be taken on the web.

Pozn.) The Czech language exam includes an interview in Czech. Candidates who provide evidence of a matriculation exam in Czech do not have to take the Czech language entrance exam and receive full points.

Article 6

Admission Examinations for the ICARD Bachelor's Degree Programme for Applicants Abroad

If an applicant for the ICARD programme is unable to attend the admission procedure in person due to a long-term stay abroad, he/she may submit a request to the dean to participate in the admission procedure via video interview. However, this form of admission procedure must be requested no later than when the application is submitted in the University Information System. This form of admission procedure does not give rise to a legal claim on the part of the applicant.

If the application is accepted, the applicant will take the admission procedure by video interview before the examination board on the date specified in the invitation. The interview will be conducted in English and will test the applicant's ability to speak on a specialist topic related to the programme and his/her knowledge of world geography within the scope of the written admission tests. In this case, the candidate is responsible for the adequacy of the transmission and the equipment used. Video interviewing is possible in particular for Stages 1 and 2 of the admission procedure. In Stage 3, it is exceptional.

Article 7

Admission procedure for Master's degree programmes

General principles

Admission to the Master's degree is subject to the submission of a Bachelor's degree from any university of agricultural, technical, economic or natural sciences. In the case of other fields of study, applicants' interest in a particular programme is also taken into account. In the case of a bachelor's degree completed abroad, it is necessary to provide a "Nostrification" of the diploma of the bachelor's degree obtained or a decision on recognition of previous studies issued by the Czech University of Life Sciences Prague.

Applications to study at the FTZ are submitted electronically at is.czu.cz/application.

A tuition fee is payable for studies conducted in English in all FTZ Master's programmes. The fee for the **Tropical Farming Systems** programme, which is offered only in double degree form, is **CZK 13,000/academic year for EU applicants and CZK 60,000/academic year for non-EU applicants**. The fee for the online distance learning **Tropical Agroecology** programme is **CZK 110,000/academic year**. The fee for the **other FTZ Master's programmes** is **CZK 8,000/academic year for EU applicants and CZK 25,000/academic year for non-EU applicants**. The fee can be paid by credit card (information on this method of payment can be found in the electronic information system after successful completion of the entrance examination), bank transfer, cheque or in person at the cash desk of the CZU Library. **The fee is payable by the day of the student's enrolment. In the event that the student does not enrol, the non-refundable part of the fee is CZK 8,000.**

Applicants can also obtain further information on the requirements and content of the admission procedure in Czech and English on the FTZ website in the "Applicants for Studies" section. The application form must be completed electronically, contain the prescribed requirements, and include one selected programme of study for the Master's degree:

- **Agri-food Systems and Rural Development (ASRD)**
- **Wildlife and Livestock Production, Management and Conservation (WLPMC) (the student also chooses a specialisation within the programme in the application form)**
- **Tropical Crop Management and Ecology (TCME)**
- **International Development and Agricultural Economics (IDAE)**
- **Tropical Forestry and Agroforestry (TFA)**
- **Tropical Farming Systems (TFS) - double degree form**
- **Tropical Agroecology (TAE) - online distance learning**

Thus, in the admission procedure, the university will assess the fulfilment of the condition of attaining higher education and obtaining a bachelor's degree from a university according to Section 48(5) of the Higher Education Act. The dean of the FTZ decides whether an examination is successful or unsuccessful on the basis of the recommendations of the individual examination boards. The decision will be notified to the applicant electronically on the portal is.czu.cz/application, usually within 7 days (it is necessary to monitor the course of the admission procedure). The applicant may request the Dean to review the decision within 30 days from the date of publication of the decision. Applicants will receive the original proof of admission upon enrolment.

In the case of successful completion of the entrance examination for applicants from countries requiring a visa to the Czech Republic, a confirmation of accommodation and the Unified Certificate of Admission to Study will be sent to the applicant by means of a transport service. However, these documents will be sent only after the proof of payment of the foreign language tuition fee and the nostrification or decision on recognition of previous education have been sent electronically to the FTZ Study Department.

The admission procedure is two-round. In the first round, which takes place without the presence of the applicant, the admissions committee selects applicants on the basis of their aptitude for study - on the basis of **the annotation of the bachelor's thesis (or similar written output), the results of previous studies completed (in the form of a transcript of marks) and the experience and aptitude for study contained in the CV and motivation letter**. The required documents (annotation of the bachelor's thesis (or similar written output), the results of the previous studies completed (in the form of a transcript of marks), CV and motivation letter) must be uploaded at the same time as the application to the University's electronic system (UIS). All documents are required in English. We require an officially certified translation for the transcript of marks, applicants from the Czech Republic may submit a transcript of marks in Czech.

Round 1 includes the Scio GAP online test in English, which focuses on the general overview of the candidate - organised in cooperation with Scio. The conditions for registering for the Scio GAP test can be found on www.scio.cz. Candidates can use more than one Scio GAP test date for a given stage of the admission procedure, the best result will be counted.

A maximum of 50 points can be obtained in the first round, which assesses the prerequisites for study on the basis of the documents submitted. The evaluation criteria are:

- 10 points - Results of previous studies
- 10 points - Abstract of bachelor thesis (or similar written output)
- 10 points - Experience and aptitude for study
- 10 points - Cover letter
- 10 points - General Overview (Scio GAP online test)

Selected applicants who reach the minimum threshold of 30 points are invited by e-mail via UIS to the second round of the admission procedure - a personal interview.

Article 10

Entrance examination subjects for Master's degree programmes and their assessment

The actual entrance exam consists of an interview in English, focused on the programme (Table 5). For the oral interviews for all programmes, applicants must achieve a **minimum score of 60 out of 100** according to the criteria listed in Table 4. The examination boards are composed of experts from the department sponsoring the relevant programme of study.

Candidates are admitted to study at the FTZ according to their scores on the entrance examination until the study programme is full (Table 5).

The Tropical Farming Systems program is accredited as a "double degree". Admission to this form is by admissions procedure, and tuition fees are set on the basis of a contract with the partner university.

The Tropical Forestry and Agroforestry programme is also accredited as a "multiple degree". Admission to this form is by admission procedure and tuition fees are set on the basis of a contract with partner universities.

Article 11

Admission procedure for applicants abroad

If the applicant cannot attend the admissions procedure in person due to a long-term stay abroad, he/she may submit a request to the Dean to participate in the admissions procedure by video interview. However, this form of admission procedure must be requested no later than when the application is submitted in the University Information System. This form of admission procedure does not give rise to a legal claim on the part of the applicant.

If the application is accepted, the applicant will take the admission procedure by video interview before the examination board on the date specified in the invitation. In this case, the candidate is responsible for the sufficiency of the quality of the transmission and the equipment used. Video interviews are possible, in particular for stages 1 and 2 of the admission procedure. It is no longer possible in Stage 3 as a general rule.

Final provisions

This regulation was discussed by the College of the Dean of FTZ on 5 June 2024.

This Regulation was discussed and approved by the Academic Senate of the FTZ CZU on 12 June 2024.

The Regulation comes into force and effect on the date of its promulgation.
